I would like to submit my view on the recourse consent application listed above,

As a sharemilker/future farm owner and Waituna lagoon catchment liaison committee member,

As I am at the early stages of my career, I hope that farming in my lifetime and my children's lifetime after me can coexist with the beautiful nature surrounding us the way it has done for centuries.

Therefore, I believe that the proposed opening threshold in the current application are to low, I believe the current levels should be closer to a 2.0 meter opening. Farming and humanity in general in the catchment is here, and for as far as I can see will be here for centuries. Therefore, it is imperative that we help the ecosystem mitigate the impacts of our presence, not only as a farmer but also as a member of society, we as humans have been, are currently and will be making an impact in many ways, and water flow and nutrient loading being of the biggest concern for the lagoon,

And in my believe for the lagoon to maintain its ecosystem, and help it clean up society's impact on this ecosystem, chiefly its water level and nutrient loading capacity it has to be opened regularly /Yearly for fish passage and releasing nutrients, and for flood management if the lagoon reaches a 2.0-meter threshold. And furthermore, as we have seen in the previous summer, not opening the lagoon can make it turn bad and have a major negative impact on the wildlife. In my belief this is directly related to not opening the lagoon at the lower levels required. now as a future farm owner, I would only think it fair that if these suggested thresholds are not considered/ implicated and the 2.5 meter. I would like for the applicants and government bodies to buy the flood affected farmlands of the people that own them at market rate so everyone is getting their stakes in this ecological balancing act treated equally. But it is my hope that this does not have to come to pass, Because I believe a healthy fresh lagoon In years to come is only possible with the lower opening threshold and a solid good working relationship between all parties concerned.
